1 Corinthians 10:1-18

¹⁰Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, [a] by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. ¹¹For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. [b] ¹²What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." ¹³Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? ¹⁴I thank God[c] that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, ¹⁵so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶(I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that,

I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) ¹⁷For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. ¹⁸For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

Dear Our Savior's,

There is a very curious expression that has floated into my ears during the first several months of my time here as your Interim Pastor. It tells us something about where you are as a congregation in terms of your mission, vision and purpose.

The phrase is, "They don't want to get blamed."

Several people have told me that they observe many folks in this congregation afraid of being blamed for making a decision that not everyone likes. Afraid of risking anything because they fear how everyone else will respond.

It seems like a good number of us here at Our Savior's might be hesitant to be in the deciding roles because we have seen our neighbors treated poorly when a tough decision needs to be made.

Now, maybe none of you reading this feel that way. But please hear me, somebody must. Otherwise, I have no idea how I would have heard that message from so many different folks in very different conversations. The one thing those conversations often have in common? Money.

Making decisions about the congregation's money is a difficult thing to do because we fear offending one another. We fear our decision will not be honored or our work appreciated. We fear our efforts will be regarded as unworthy.

How many of you want to be in a position where that is what you feel? Does that make you want to volunteer to help lead the congregation?

I am fairly certain that there are a good number of you here who do want to honor and appreciate the work of your neighbors. I am completely confident that all of you want to find a way to support and love your leaders, just as you do all your neighbors in God's kingdom.

So how?

We spent the month of Sundays in January talking together about Stewardship. Our themes were first Ownership, then Gratitude and last week, Generosity. Under these themes we talked about how we are given the gift to live together as a community, and together we steward (or care for) what we have been given. This includes financially supporting your ministry as well as doing the ministry. And that takes leaders 4 and ground workers and people of all gifts working together in unity, as Paul says to the church in Corinth above.

Like the church in Corinth, the church in Albany is full of people who are grateful and responding generously to what God has done for them. I know, I get to sit with you one on one! This year, I would like to invite you into a new spiritual practice. Like the offering, it is a practice most of you already do, but we can do it with more intention. Let us join in a spiritual practice of sitting down one on one with other members of this congregation and getting to know each other more deeply. You already know some of these people really well, well, some of you do. But there are many people here who have not formed those deep relationships. Folks who didn't grow up here or folks who have moved from a different church to OSLC.

How might it transform our community if we sat down and asked each other this one question: How has Our Savior saved you this week?

Yes, you can talk about whatever else you want to. If you are intentionally in a one on one, deeply listening to that other person, the spiritual practice is on the right track. But if we can take it one step deeper and ask and answer this question, just think what God might do!

I am looking forward to the annual meeting happening this coming Sunday, as I write this. I am looking forward to watching vour faithful leaders do their best to lead you as a community. I am grateful for the opportunity to listen deeply to them and to you as I spend time with you for a little while, in this Interim time. And I challenge you to use this Interim well. Take this time to deeply know someone in the congregation you do not yet know. Learn about their faith, the rock that God has built this church upon, and share your own. Let us be blessed by God's ever-present love showing up in each and every one of your lives.

May Our Savior make visible the ways he has saved you this week!

Communication Covenant November 19, 2019

In order for us to build healthy, open relationships throughout the congregation and solve any concerns, the Council & Staff have adopted the following communication covenant to encourage equal voice, diversity of opinions, consensus and support for the group decision. In order to accomplish this task, we agree to the following:

- We offer and seek clarity in communication. We will not make assumptions about one another because they can damage our relationships and prevent us from doing God's Work.
- We will be honest and straightforward with each other. We will not manipulate each other.
- We will bring our contributions to the whole group, not burdening individuals with a concern the whole group needs to figure out together.
- To maintain strong relationships in our fellowship, we will go directly to any person with whom we have a concern and speak with them about it in Christian love. (Matthew 18)
 - If someone has a problem with an individual and comes

to you instead, encourage them to go to that person.

- If someone consistently will not go to the person they have a concern with, go with them to meet with the person.
- We will respect confidentiality.
 - Reasons to share confidential information include:

-A person that is going to do physical harm to someone else or themselves.

-A child has been physically, emotionally or sexually abused.

- So that we might respond, we expect signatures on any written critiques or letters.
- Council meetings are open and welcome for all congregation members to listen.
 - We will utilize executive sessions for discussions that need to be confidential.

Lent is a time of reflection and repentance, of sacrifice and selfexamination. But Lent is also a season of hope — hope in the work God is doing in the world.

For OSLC's Lent Giving 2020, Congregational Life & Mission Committee will be asking you to support the ministry of Kristin Wolford, missionary to the Dominican Republic.

Kristin grew up in Our Savior's Lutheran. She lives in the Dominican Republic with her husband Joselo and two young boys, Elliot and Evan.

In 2011, Kristin Wolford began working with a group of young adults from Iglesia Centro Cristiano Shalom in Hato Mayor del Rey. She helped these young people start a ministry that works with children living in poverty right in their cities. Today, this ministry includes over 30 young adults from four cities who travel to eight different neighborhoods to reach over 250 children every week, all year long. Our specific focus for Lent Giving will be the expansion project for Kristin's ministry:

Ministry Expansion: Water Center

Their ministry is growing rapidly. In order to support and sustain the ministry financially, they are purchasing land, drilling a well and starting a small business to purify and sell drinking water. This will provide jobs, clean drinking water for the community and the economic boost needed to commission youth to new locations and reach even more children and families for Christ.



Water is very dear to people in this area. They have to travel long distances to have safe water in their homes.

The total cost of the Water Center is \$145,000. \$101,000 has already been raised. To open the center another \$44,000 is needed. This business will allow the ministry to:

- Sell safe and affordable drinking water to our neighbors and the surrounding community
- Disciple and empower more youth to lead as agents of change in their neighborhoods
- Expand our ministry to reach more children with the Gospel and academic tutoring
- Provide full-time jobs for at least nine people
- Add sustainability to our ministry right here in the Dominican Republic

3. Support her: Send a Bible verse or a special quote that you feel she would like. Maybe it is a comic strip for some laughs!

4. Gifts: If you wish to send her a small gift for a special occasion (birthday or anniversary), please keep it simple. (Homemade goodies are always a good choice). If you do not have money for gifts, your heartfelt words on a blank piece of paper can be very meaningful. Let the ideas flow from your heart. They do not need to be expensive.

At our next Heart-to-Heart gathering in February 2020, we will have a big REVEALING party where those of you who were participating in 2020 will reveal yourself to your Heart-to-Heart friend. We ask that you bring a gift for her.
