

Dear Siblings in Christ,

COVID19 has changed all of our lives. Mindfulness is a spiritual practice that I find helpful during this time. As I pay attention to the ways that life has changed, the ways that I am both grateful and sorrowful, I find my spirit lifted and more able to stay the course.

Paying attention to myself and my internal responses to things can give me so many opportunities to reach for God. God, help me.

God, Thank you. God, remind me. God, this is beautiful. All these are simple, mindful prayers.

My friend, fellow pastor and former nurse, Pastor Caitlin Trussel, posted this on her social media over the last few days:

“Bonuses of mask wearing:

1. Don't have to worry if food is stuck in my teeth.
2. Extra garlic at lunch means I offend only myself.
3. Pop of color to suit mood.
4. Your risk drops of getting Covid from me unawares.

Quadruple wins right there.”

This post made me smile, and called me back to mindfulness.

And not only that, we had several social media friends add to the list:

5. Protects half your face from the sun!
6. Only need to put makeup on your eyes (I know the guys really can relate).

7. No strangers tell you to smile. Maybe you have your own to add? It is too easy to get caught up in the nuisance of things like masks, and to forget the reason we go through the trouble of wearing them. If you haven't seen it, there is some new research(1) out that is leaning towards mask wearing being more important. The trick is, and I struggle with this, doing it effectively.(2)

Alongside the masks, I am mindful of the struggle of those who are ill. And a new aspect of this was brought to light for me this week. What would I do if Steve and I got sick, who would take care of our kids? Would my 8 & 9 year old be responsible enough to take care of us? Do I want to put that burden on them? I have heard from pastors in other communities that one brings different meals to a home if you know an 8 year old is the one preparing it for the family. So I found these resources(3) helpful to think through my plan for when (or if) we get sick. And here is a template(4) to use to write out and share your plan with your closest helpers.

We all will be living with this virus for a long time, unfortunately. And I know that can be painful to read. Grief is completely normal - sadness, anger, denial, bargaining - we go through it all before we are able to come to acceptance that life is just different now. But we still are living our new life in

Christ, even in the midst of the pandemic. We are still given the gifts of God's abundant grace and resurrection life. I pray you are open to living mindfully right now. First, mindful of God's presence. Mindful of your internal life and how you are perceiving God. Mindful of those around you, mindful of God's love flowing through you to them.

Even in the midst of change, we live, mindful that God has already done for us all that we need.

May the Peace of Christ be with you always.

Mission Endowment Fund

Over the past several months, the Congregational Council Executive Committee has been exploring different ways of expanding on the generous financial gifts bestowed on us by Vern and Eddie. Through discussions with the ELCA and other financial partners such as Thrivent, we have decided to move forward with forming a Mission Endowment Fund.

By creating an ongoing financial resource above and beyond regular offerings, mission endowment funds enable congregations to expand outreach in the local community and around the world, sponsor missionaries, and fund scholarships, for example. Steady income streams from the fund can also help us achieve other goals envisioned by our members, such as building improvements and educational opportunities for our youth--things not covered in

our annual budget. In addition to strengthening our ministry, mission endowment funds are a hallmark of sound financial stewardship. We will be able to offer congregational members the flexibility to make outright and planned gifts, and manage large gifts more effectively--making the most of all that God has blessed us with.

With information and guidance from the Synod, the Executive Committee has started the legwork to further advance this initiative. Next steps involve the formation of a five-member Endowment Committee, which is integral to establishing the fund (with congregational approval) and managing it going forward. Dear Friend,

Though we are in different countries, immersed in different languages, climates, cultures, governments and economies, I suspect we have something in common right now: these past few months have not gone as we imagined they would.

First COVID-19, the unexpected roadblocks that were placed on your path, loved ones falling ill, isolation, and the challenge of sorting through all the interpretations of why COVID-19 happened and how we should respond.

Now, we hear about the murder of Mr. George Floyd in Minneapolis and all the hurt, fear, outrage, distrust. We see and carry a determination to find a meaningful way to respond so this might be the very last tragedy of this kind to ever occur.

It is all so hard. COVID-19 affected your daily routines, your work, your family, your relationships, your emotions, and so much more. Now, your heart hurts. Your head is spinning. You see chaos and destruction. You see your neighbor in pain. You want to do something, but you're not quite sure what you could say or do that would really make a difference.

Our Ramas Vivas team in the Dominican Republic is writing now to reach out and let you, a

dear and faithful member of our team, know that we care about you; we're thankful for you; and we're praying for you as you wade through all of this.

Ramas Vivas continues to stick with our four main objectives through COVID-19:

1. Grow in unity as a team.
2. Care for our team members.
3. Disciple our team members.
4. Add value to our community through the crisis.

Today, we add number 5: Pray daily for YOU, our ministry partners.

You matter to us. Your family matters to us. Your thoughts and emotions matter to us, and your work in the United States – the way you respond to all of this is important. We pray for grace, courage, wisdom, strength, understanding and love as you take your next step on what might be a totally new road for you. You can do this!

Here in the Dominican Republic, we are ok. We've been doing a lot of electronic communication to check in with team members, do small group Bible studies, "gather" as a team, strategize with leadership, pray and worship together.

Since many of the teacher's of our children's classes are still in school themselves and come from families where parents live day-to-day financially, for the past few months we've given extra financial

support to many of them.

We've also been able to gift many of the children's families with a big bag of groceries. We know by the tears of relief and heartfelt expressions of gratitude from their parents that things are tough right now for many in the Dominican Republic. Some estimate that by the time this pandemic is over, we could lose at least 10 years' progress in the fight against poverty.

The construction of the water project was stalled for a few months and is just now starting up again. I've included a list of the remaining pieces of equipment we need to purchase to reach our economic goal.

Just a few days ago, government officials informed us that we are phasing into a new season they are calling "Living safely with COVID-19." More businesses were allowed to open this week. Churches will be allowed to have one meeting a week starting on June 3rd. There are other phases to the plan that takes us into July and August. We continue to step into the unknown in faith, holding tightly to the One who goes before us.

May your grief, the tension you feel and the burdens you carry for your family, your neighbors, your state, your nation and our world lead you closer to Jesus who will give you the courage and faith you need to step forward on a new path.

Enter and review your giving information and choose Process. Once the donation is processed, a confirmation screen will appear. And you're DONE—it's that simple!

Vanco (the servicing agent of OSLC online giving) also provides the Give Plus+ app you can access from your Smart Phone or tablet.

You can also put a stamp on your offering envelope and drop it in the mail.
