I saw that there was a wonderful first worship service inside the building on October 18th. I certainly enjoyed worshipping with my family at home, though it was strange to be participating from afar. Thank you to The Rev. Dee Pederson for her presiding and preaching on that day that I was in quarantine with my family. Thank you for joining us for worship, wearing your masks and coming together to celebrate all that God has done for us!

## Dear Members of Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Albany, Minnesota:

A simple “thank you” after your recent vote in favor of investing yet again in our water project in the Dominican Republic isn't enough to express the deep gratitude I have for you.

From the very beginning of my journey as a missionary, you were there. I still have the bulletin from the day Pastor Brad called me to the front of the church to “send me off.” I shared that I felt led by God to leave my teaching position and go to the Dominican Republic for an undefined period of time and uncertain how God might provide. Many of you came up to lay hands on me. You prayed and sent me off with a blessing.



Your prayers and support have not ceased over these past ten years. I am humbled, grateful and honored that you have chosen to join me in this call to serve the people of the Dominican Republic.

What does it mean that “I am your missionary” as you've posted in the bulletins? It has meant different things to different people. Some of you have shown your support through your faithful prayers and words of encouragement. Others of you have traveled to the Dominican Republic to meet the people and participate in the work with your own hands and voice. A handful of you have listened to reports and updates. And, many more of you have invested hard-earned financial resources to bless people you don't even know in another part of the world.

Some of you have lived in a foreign country or you have sent children off to unfamiliar places. Many of you have seen poverty – the smells, sounds, suffering. You've allowed your heart to break at the injustice and have felt helpless over and over again.

You may know what it's like to learn and communicate every day in a second language, give birth in foreign hospitals, live among people whose culture and lifestyle are different from your own, be the obvious foreigner everywhere you go and raise a family in a place that many days feels nothing like home.

I hope you see why your partnership is so meaningful to me.

I wish you could see what I've seen: the joy in the faces of children who receive very little attention at home as they run to meet their loving leaders or the tears of gratitude that stream from the face of a mother gifted with a mattress after sleeping on the cement floor with her children or a young person growing stronger in faith, leadership and passion for the work of the Lord or an elderly woman who cannot stand on her own but can list one hardship after another worship the Lord with her whole heart after receiving a new house.

The sacrifices that we've made are worth it.

This is a difficult time for many people all over the world. There is illness, death, isolation, job loss, racial tension, division, uncertainty and so much more. Our enemy is doing his job well – to rob, kill, lie and destroy. Some of you have been dealt a hand that I know nothing about, and life has been hard.

That's the beauty of belonging to the community of believers. Though at times we may feel alone, we're not. We may not ever completely understand one another's difficulties but we can turn together to the One who has endured all things: "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses" (Heb 4:15). We can pray for one another, have compassion for each other, encourage one another daily to trust, believe and hold on to the promises of God.

When the Ramas Vivas Board of Directors decided that we should build a center to purify and sell safe drinking water to our community to satisfy this basic need and provide an economic engine for our ministry, I was both excited and overwhelmed.

Friends, with your recent investment, we have reached our financial goal. Through people like you, God has provided an amount that seemed too high and impossible to me at times. It's amazing! The jobs this will provide, the people who will be reached with the safe water, and the hundreds, perhaps thousands, of children and youth who will experience the love of Christ because of this project is something to celebrate!



I ask you to continue to pray and believe with me that God who has brought us this far will carry us through. The building is yet to be complete, the equipment still needs to be purchased and our business plan needs to be implemented. There are more challenges ahead.

I pray that we will celebrate together many more stories of God's faithfulness as we continue to follow wherever He leads. May you experience an outpouring of God's provision, favor and peace and may you have joy because your contributions are helping to transform lives for the glory of God.
